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Juniper Branch. Land was granted to Timothy Williams by patent dated 22 December 1768. Wit.: Jesse McClendon (McClindon?) and Jacob Williams. (See notes 44, 45, and 48.)

Page 340. Bill of Sale: Neomi Cook to Elizabeth Cook. Dated: 10 January 1778. Trans.: "divers good Causes and Valuable consideration" for "all and Singular my Goods and and (sic) Chattles Household stuff and all other my substance Whatsoever." Wit.: Jonathan Cook Parker and Lazarus Cook. (See notes 44, 45, and 48.)

Page 341. Deed: Jesse Barfield to William Daniel. Dated: 2 October 1777 (17th year of George III, etc.). Trans.: 60 pounds for 140 acres "On the North side of the North East Swamp Joining and Between William Whitfield and George Kornegays lines and Beginning at the Head of the Huckle Berry Branch on the South side of the Sooty Branch at William Whitfields upper Corner in the same Survey." Deed mentions the mouth of Jumping Run (in the Northeast Swamp), the mouth of Rooty (sic) Branch (in Jumping Run), and the mouth of Huckleberry Branch (in Rooty Branch). Mentions a patent but does not specify to whom it was granted or when. Wit.: Edward Outlaw and Owen O. Daniel. (See notes 44, 45, and 48.)

Page 343. Deed: Frances Hill to Richard Hill. Dated: 12 May 1777. Trans.: 15 pounds for 150 acres "On the East side of Great Coheary On the Head of Kills Peacocks Swamp Joining above Hannah Goodricks upper line." Deed mentions a pond. Wit.: Jesse Ward and Joseph Vick. A receipt follows the deed. (See notes 44, 45, and 48.)

Page 344. Deed: Abraham Molton to Stephen Middleton. Dated: 23 March 1776. Trans.: 200 pounds for 230 acres "On ash Branch Beginning... On the Run of ash Branch in the mouth of Eleax Branch." Deed mentions "a Bay in the Head of ash Branch." Mentions the quit rents payable "to his majesty King George the third." Wit.: John Molton and William Kenan. (See notes 44, 45, and 48.)

Page 345. Deed: George Frazer to William Lewis. Dated: 23 August 1777. Trans.: 15 pounds for 115 acres "On the North side of Goshen Swamp Beginning... at the Head of Hog Branch Joyning Leavin Stanleys line." Deed mentions John Stanly. Wit.: Hardy Nollyboy (Nolly) and John Stanly. (See notes 43, 44, and 45.)

Page 347. Deed: James Picket to Benton Williford. Dated: 10 May 1777 ("in the first year of our Independence"). Trans.: 35 pounds for 200 acres "On the East side of the North East side (sic) of the North East branch of Cape Fear River On the North side of Cypress Creek." Land was granted to Joseph Pearce by patent dated 23 December 1763 (4th year of George III). Wit.: William Picket, James Lockhart, and James Hollingsworth. (See notes 43, 44, and 45.)

Page 348. Deed: Richard Salmon and wife, Frances Salmon, to Hardy Nolloboy (Nollyboy). Dated: 18 February 1777. Trans.: 175 pounds for 286 acres "On the North side of Goshen swamp Between Matthew Whitfield and William Stephens lands." Land was granted to Aaron Daniel by patent dated 16 November 1764. Wit.: John Standley, Charity Standley, and Elizabeth Standley. (See notes 43, 44, and 45.)

Page 349. Deed: George Miller (a merchant of Dobbs County) and Company to William Ball. Dated: 13 August 1776. Trans.: 45 pounds for 150 acres "On the East side of Cohary Little (sic) Swamp." Land was granted to Thomas Odom by patent dated 21 April 1764 "and sold by the said Thomas Odom to Thomas Patterson



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
